The all-age approach

Intergenerational practice is based on people of all ages working together to create understanding, respect and strong vibrant communities. (LGNI, 2014)

'Ageing begins with the moment of birth, and it ends only when life itself has ended. Life is a continuum; only, we -- in our stupidity and blindness -- have chopped it up into little pieces and kept all those little pieces separate." (Maggie Kuhn, 1978)



Rationale for the all-age approach

- Age is as big a divider as gender but is not yet recognised as such
- Economic and social policy is not responding effectively to the ageing of the planet
- Ageist stereotypes intersect a range of social issues
- Age-stereotyping is perpetuated by agesegregated practice
