Gaps in implementation of the Convention



- Disability programmes and policies: How does Northern Ireland measure up? (Disability Action: January 2012):-
- Awareness Raising (Article 8);
- Participation in Public and Political Life (Article 29);
- Access to Information (Articles and 21) and Statistics and Data Collection (Article 31).

Gaps in implementation of the Convention (cont).



- Shortfalls in public policy and programme delivery in Northern Ireland relative to the Articles of the UNCRPD (QUB: 2014) :-
- Equality and non-discrimination (Article 5);
- Equal recognition before the law (Article 12);
- Living independently and being included in the community (Article 19);
- Education (Article 24);
- Health (Article 25);
- Adequate standard of living and social protection (Article 28).

Relevant law reform initiatives



- Analysis of Bills and Policies e.g. welfare reform;
- Mental Capacity (NI) Bill:
- Ministerial Commitment to ensure compatibility with the UNCRPD <u>but</u> challenges in making paradigm shift;
- Emphasis on respecting autonomy;
- Emphasis on supported decision making;
- Statutory definition of restraint;
- New offences to address ill treatment and wilful neglect.
