CAIN has, for example, chronologies of key events, databases of facts and figures, abstracts on organisations and biographies of prominent people. Collections of photographs on topics such as murals, posters, and ephemeral material are also maintained on the site.

CAIN has already helped thousands of researchers, teachers, and students from around the world with their work on Northern Ireland, and the site is an invaluable resource for local people as well.

CAIN is one of the core resources within ARK, a resource that aims to make social and political information on Northern Ireland available to the widest possible audience.
