The Children's Research Database contains concise and lay-friendly summaries of research on all aspects of children's lives in Northern Ireland.

The purpose of the database is to provide a central point for the collation of all research on children and young people in Northern Ireland. The database provides a 'one-stop shop' for users of research. It also facilitates researchers in disseminating their findings, and so helps to avoid duplication in future research.

The framework for the research database is based on the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

This database is a result of a collaborative project between the Child Care Research Forum and the Office of the First Minister and Deputy First Minister.
