NIHPS

- Wave 3 of the NIHPS (2003)
- Variable component (repeated every 3 to 5 years):
 - Children and parenting
- Respondents to this component:
 - All parents of children < 16
 - Each parent asked about each child living in the household (up to total of 6)
- Total responses: 1,629







Parent/child interaction

- Talking
- Praising
- Hugging
- Quarrelling
- Yelling
- Smacking
- Key Variables:
 - Gender of parent, gender and age of child

Physical punishment

Attitudes to physical punishment in Northern Ireland

- Northern Ireland Omnibus Survey (2001)
 - 34% of respondents said that physical punishment was acceptable
- Office of Law Reform consultation paper (2001)
 - 89% of respondents said physical punishment effective
 - 88% said physical punishment appropriate
