Sample

- Invited: all young people living in Northern Ireland who receive Child Benefit and celebrated their 16th birthday in February and March 2010
- Postal questionnaire sent out in November 2010
- Online version of questionnaire
- One follow-up ten days later







Response rate

- 786 responded (response rate 21%)
 - paper completions (85%)
 - online (15%)
- £500 prize draw (5x£100.00 cash)
- £10 gift vouchers for first 100 online respondents








'Credit Crunch'

To what extent has the recent economic crisis ('credit crunch') affected you and your family (%)?










Young Carers

Ever caring responsibility? (%)











Young carers












Respondents saying the following factors restricted them 'a lot' in taking part in leisure time activities (mean scores)












Play and Leisure: Consultation with young people

- Females were more likely than males to have been asked their opinion by teachers and youth workers
- Respondents from well-off families were more likely to be asked their opinion by their parents and town planners/developers
- Respondents from grammar schools were most likely to have been asked their opinion by teachers but least likely to have been asked by youth workers

The Context







Grooming

When someone tries to build a relationship or gain the trust of a young person with the aim of getting them to take part in some kind of sexual activity....









1 in 9

said an adult had tried to groom them







Grooming


- 45% of those who said someone had tried to groom them, said it happened more than once
- 75% said it happened when they were under the age of consent
- 90% said the person who tried to groom them was male







Grooming: First contact









Grooming

- 1 in 8 engaged in sexual texts, emails or conversations
- 1 in 12 sent or received sexual images
- At least 6% had some form of face to face sexual contact







Use of substances

1 in 15

said someone had given them alcohol, solvents or drugs and taken advantage of them when they were under the influence







Use of substances

- 2/3 of those who said they had been given substances then taken advantage of, were under the age of consent when this happened
- 2/3 said it was someone of a similar age who did this to them







'Sex' in exchange for...

1 in 20

said they had been offered something in exchange for taking part in sexual activity







'Sex' in exchange for...

- 80% of those who said they had been offered something in return for sexual activity, were under the age of consent when this first happened
- 40% were offered this by someone 5 or more years older than them








'Sex' in exchange for...



Respondents saying relations between Catholics and Protestants are better now than 5 years ago (%)










Respondents saying that relations between Catholics and Protestants will be better in 5 years than now (%)










Respondents saying that religion will always make a difference to the way people feel about each other in Northern Ireland










Respondents saying they prefer to live in religiously mixed neighbourhoods (%)










Respondents they prefer to work in religiously mixed workplaces (%)










Respondents they would prefer to send their children to religiously mixed schools (%)










Government and Rights of Children
