- Variables which were not significant
  - -Gender
  - -Social class
  - -Time spent outside Northern Ireland
- Variables which were significant



#### % of respondents describing themselves as 'very' or 'a little' prejudiced by National Identity










## % of respondents describing themselves as 'very' or 'a little' prejudiced by Party support



## How to interpret the data

- Increased prejudice?
- Increased willingness to report prejudice?
- Difference in survey construction?
- Divergence between perception of prejudice in the general population and own reported prejudice
