







COVID19 – Mental and physical health








COVID19 – Impact on education

Those with disability/long-term illness which affected their lives a lot were much less likely to receive careers advice (only 66% saying they did)

Those with disability/long-term illness and those who planned to go to university had lower levels of confidence in their careers options.







Shared Education (DE)

- 51% of respondents said they were involved in Shared Education.
- Of those who were not, 43% said they would like to be involved.
- The most likely Shared Education activity respondents were involved in were joint projects (67%), followed by joint classes (40%) and sharing facilities (37%).

• 64% of those who had taken part in Shared Education agreed or strongly agreed that, since then, they were able to better respect the views of others.

Definition

By 'acts of violence' we mean any criminal offences or any words or behaviours which hurt or cause fear or anxiety to a victim or which humiliate or belittle them.



Experience of violence. By gender












Respondents saying: 'never' acceptable.

Pressured a girl or woman to share an intimate photo


Posted a comment or joke of a sexual nature about a girl or woman

Gender-based violence: Some comments








Good relations - perceptions

16-year olds saying that relationships between Protestants and Catholics are better now than five years ago (%)





16-year olds saying that relationships between Protestants and Catholics will be better in five years' times (%)





Respondents saying religion will always make a difference to how people feel about each other in Northern Ireland (%)










Good relations – Preferences for mixing








Political attitudes – Party support

If an election was held tomorrow and 16 year olds could vote, which party would you vote for (%)










Political attitudes – Party preferences

* YLT respondents who said 'Don't know' or 'I would not vote' are excluded.








Political attitudes - Political identity

Do you think of yourself as Unionist, Nationalist or neither?










Politics – Good Friday Agreement

Do you think the Good Friday Agreement is still important and relevant for your generation? By political identity(%)










Attitudes to the Brexit protocol
