- Shared Education (Both)
- Young Carers (YLT)
- Child Sexual Exploitation (YLT)
- Strategies for Staying Calm in School (KLT)
- Sport and Physical Activities (Both)
- Aspirations to study/work abroad or learn an additional language (YLT)

This event is predominantly for organisations, researchers and school staff who work with and on behalf of children and young people. We are delighted that June Wilkinson, head of the OFMDFM Children and Young People's Unit has agreed to give the opening address.

### **Directions to the Venue – The School of Sociology, Social Policy and Social Work**
