


What's this Kids' Life and Times thing?




Well I didn't really know what to put down for that question. I mean I didn't hate school but I didn't love it either.




Were you bullied? Although 22% of children said they had been physically bullied 'a lot or a little' in the past 2 months, those who had been bullied were way more likely than everyone else to say that they had been unhappy at their school (10%) or who couldn't decide (24%).

Did you answer those questions in the survey about how some schools help children to cope with stress? You know the question about whether your school does something like Take Ten and Steady Eddy?



Oh was that what it was about!!! I thought it was going to be a maths question. You know like, Take ten Eddies and if eight of them play football how many go swimming?





NO! These are like classes that help children deal to with stress and A Safe Place is somewhere that you can go if you need to calm down. About a fifth of children said they had something like this in their school. But even if schools didn't have these schemes, teachers were still trying to help kids with tips about dealing with stress. 40% of children said that their teacher taught them how to breathe deeply before doing something important.



You mean like dive underwater?



NO you idiot! Before doing anything important that was going to make someone feel nervous. 56% of the children also said that they knew how to go to a place in their imagination where they felt safe and 57% said they could get less stressed by imagining happy thoughts.








Looks a bit messy I think

Well they asked us what we thought should be on next year's survey and you can tell from the word picture that things about school are really really important to children because so many kids used that word.










I feel so sorry for your teacher!








KLT Survey 2015
