The Northern Ireland Road Safety Partnership was launched on 1 July 2003 under the name 'Northern Ireland Safety Camera Scheme'. This aims to change drivers' attitudes towards speed and reduce the number of casualties on Northern Ireland's roads. The scheme focuses on locations where there is a history of collisions and a speeding problem, or where collisions are caused by breach of a red light.

It consists of 3 fixed speed cameras in Belfast, 3 average speed camera systems in Belfast and Bangor, and 11 speed camera vans that operate throughout Northern Ireland. There are also 5 fixed Red Light Running cameras at junctions in Belfast and 1 in Foyle.
