This event presents new findings on public attitudes towards transgender people in Northern Ireland, using data from the 2018 Life and Times Survey. It explores levels of self-reported prejudice and attitudes towards contemporary public debates in this area. The session will provide space to discuss the meaning of the findings and explore how, if going forward, such surveys might capture more nuanced attitudes, particularly relating to the visibility of trans people in public life.

The Life and Times Survey is an annual survey recording the attitudes of the public of Northern Ireland to a wide range of social issues. The 2018 survey included questions relating to respect; good relations; minority ethnic groups; equality issues; community safety and perceptions of paramilitary influence; political attitudes and BREXIT; palliative care and advance care planning.
